I hope everyone had an enjoyable Holiday season and you're looking forward to 2016. To follow-up on some old business, the City of Rochester Hills planted our new trees in November; two (2) Lindens and one (1) Kentucky Coffee Tree. Thanks again to the City for providing these trees at no cost to the Association.

At the last Board meeting, and in previous newsletters, there has been dialog about the condition of the pond. The Board feels they are on the right track with the use of the digestive pellets to reduce the muck layer and will continue to use them this coming season. We will also look into getting some water quality testing done to provide the Board with a pond health report. Restocking was also discussed, but that decision will wait until water quality reports are in.

The Board was busy this fall with the approval of a few home improvement projects. It is good to see neighbors making these improvements and investing in their homes but, please remember per the Association Building and Use Restrictions, any addition or out building must be approved by the Board, regardless of size. The process is fairly simple and plans should be submitted to the Board, usually by email. The Board reviews and is typically able to approve via email as well. Approval times vary, but the Board asks that you allow at least two weeks to process. *(continued on the back...)*

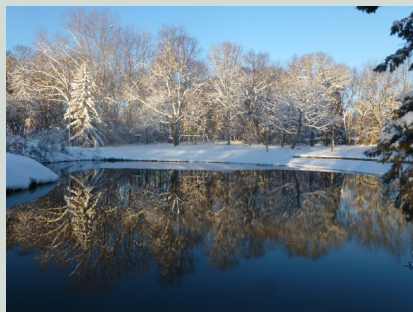

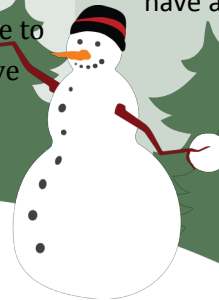


Also remember, some of the City building codes are different than the subs. Subdivision codes supersede the City's, so just because they say "all is good," you still need sub approval. The best way to be in the clear is if you are checking with the City you should also check with the sub. For reference, the Building and Use Restrictions are available on the subdivision website rochdale.sub.com or you can call me if you have any questions.

- A parent should always determine if the ice is safe.
- At least four inches of ice is needed to support one person.
- Keep in mind as ice gets older it becomes weaker.
- Take extra caution at the east end of the pond. The ice is usually thinner there and tends to thaw first due to the water outlet.
- Use the Buddy System when heading to the pond and have a phone with you.
